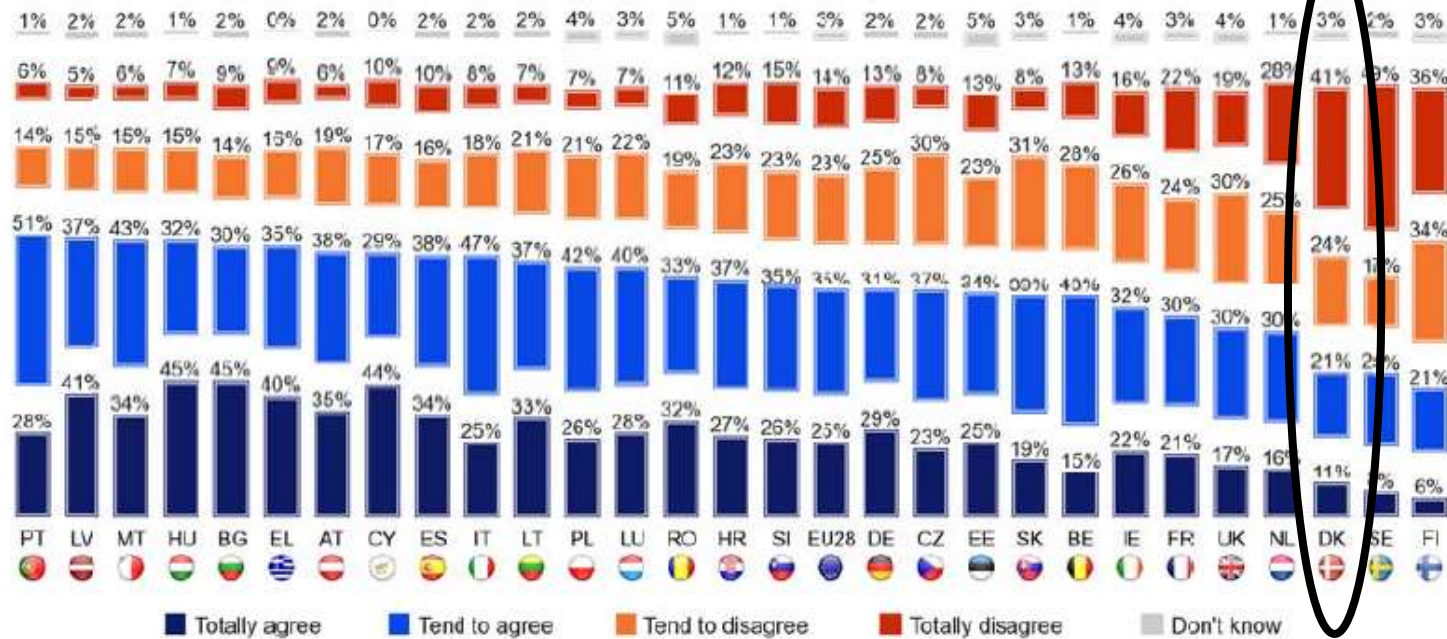

All in all family life suffers when the mother has a full time job

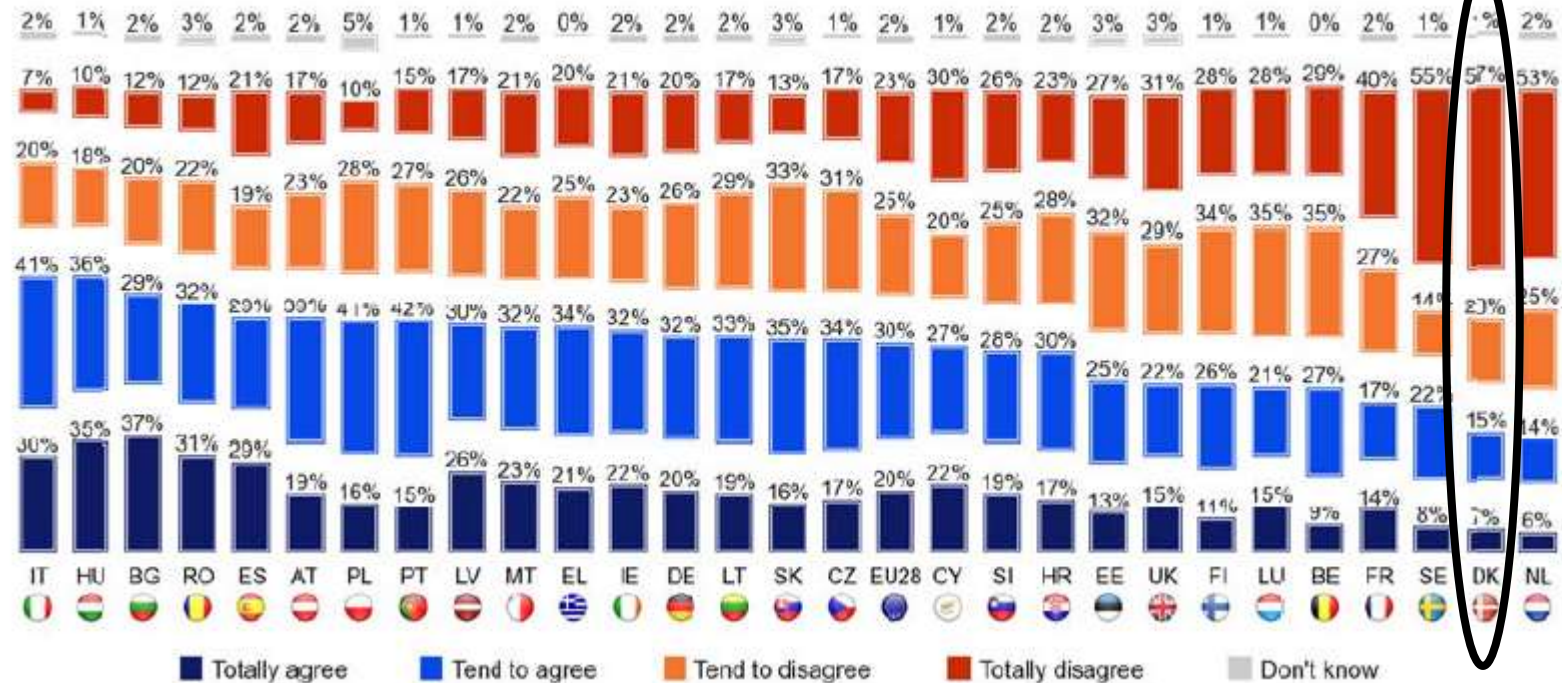


2. Norms (2/3)
